### CHAMPAGNE

Created in 1876 for Tsar Alexander II, Cristal remains a benchmark of sophistication and precision in Champagne. Sourced exclusively from Louis Roederer's Grand Cru vineyards, the wine is a seamless blend of Pinot Noir and Chardonnay, cultivated with biodynamic care and aged patiently on its lees.

The result is Champagne of remarkable purity and poise—delicate citrus and stone fruit layered with notes of brioche, almond, and chalk. Silky in texture yet vibrant in structure, Cristal unfolds with quiet power and endless length. A true expression of grace, depth, and timeless luxury.

While each vintage has its own nuances, Cristal has a recognizable house style: elegant, precise, and silky.

#### Appearance:

Brilliant pale golden colour with a fine, persistent mousse (stream of bubbles).

#### Nose:

Youthful Cristal: notes of citrus zest (lemon, orange), white flowers, and green apple, evolving into brioche, almond, and chalky minerality.

#### Palate:

Perfect balance of richness and finesse. Flavors of pear, citrus, stone fruits, and subtle spice, underpinned by a signature chalky minerality from the limestone soils of Champagne.

The texture is silky and seamless, with remarkable depth and length. The finish is crisp, pure, and lingering, often described as “liquid precision.”



Crafted in Salzburg since 1954, Mozart Chocolate Liqueur blends fine cocoa, bourbon vanilla, and fresh cream into a luxurious harmony — a tribute to the city’s most famous composer. First launched internationally in 1981, the collection now includes Gold, Dark, and White Chocolate varieties, each hand-finished in its signature foil-wrapped bottle. A masterpiece of Austrian craftsmanship and indulgence.



### **Mozart Milk Chocolate (Gold)**

Silky and rounded, with notes of Belgian milk chocolate, vanilla, and a touch of caramel.

### **Mozart Dark Chocolate**

Intense and refined, balancing bittersweet cocoa with hints of espresso and roasted nuts.

### **Mozart White Chocolate**

Lusciously soft and aromatic, offering tones of fresh cream, white chocolate, and a whisper of vanilla bean.

### **Glenfiddich 21 Year Old Gran Reserva – Speyside, Scotland**

Matured for two decades in oak casks and finished in Caribbean rum barrels, this exceptional single malt marries Glenfiddich's signature orchard fruit with rich notes of toffee, ginger, and exotic spice. Hints of banana and dried fig unfold on a warm, lingering finish. Elegant, tropical, and deeply refined.

Glenfiddich, founded in 1887 by William Grant in Dufftown, is one of the few remaining family-owned distilleries and among the pioneers of single malt Whisky.



### **Glenfiddich 23 Year Old Grand Cru – Speyside, Scotland**

Matured in American and European oak before a rare finishing in French cuvée casks, this exquisite malt delivers notes of brioche, pear, and vanilla cream, with subtle layers of white grape and oak spice. Opulent, celebratory, and impeccably smooth.

Fitz is a modern English sparkling wine brand founded in 2016 by Divergent Drinks in Worthing, West Sussex. Created as a fun, fruit-forward alternative to the traditional Champagne-style English sparkling wines, Fitz became the first producer in England to use the Charmat (tank) method, the same technique used for Prosecco. This approach results in a lighter, fresher, and more approachable style, highlighting crisp fruit flavours rather than biscuity notes. The wines are made from a blend of Chardonnay, Seyval Blanc, Reichensteiner, and Madeleine Angevine grapes sourced from vineyards across southern England. Because the Charmat method doesn't qualify under the "English Sparkling Wine" designation, Fitz proudly labels its bottles as "Sparkling Wine Made in England." The brand name, "Fitz," comes from the Anglo-Norman word meaning "son of," historically used for royal illegitimate children — a nod to its rebellious spirit and tagline, "Rulers Breed Rebels."

### **Bottega Gold**

A luxurious Prosecco from the Veneto region of Italy, crafted from Glera grapes grown in the hills near Valdobbiadene. Its iconic gold bottle preserves freshness and evokes Venetian opulence. Expect vibrant notes of apple, pear, and white flowers with a refined, dry finish.

### **Bottega Rose Gold**

An elegant sparkling rosé made from Pinot Noir grapes from Lombardy. The rose-gold bottle mirrors its delicate pink hue, offering aromas of wild berries, cherry, and floral undertones. Sophisticated and balanced, it embodies Italian glamour and craftsmanship.

Edinburgh Gin Mulled Gin is a seasonal creation from the Edinburgh Gin Distillery, inspired by the flavours and aromas of traditional winter markets. Building on the brand's Scottish distilling heritage, it combines classic gin botanicals with festive spices to create a warm, aromatic expression perfect for the colder months. On the nose, it offers inviting notes of cinnamon, clove, and orange peel. The palate is rich and smooth, balancing juniper with sweet spice and subtle hints of red fruit, leading to a lingering, gently spiced finish.

The Cairngorm Gin Special Edition is a small-batch spirit crafted in the heart of the Scottish Highlands to celebrate the 70th anniversary of the Cairngorm reindeer herd, which has freely roamed the area since 1952. Produced using pure River Spey water and locally inspired botanicals, it reflects the wild beauty of the national park. On the nose, it opens with bright notes of sweet orange peel and gentle spice over a backbone of juniper and pine. The palate delivers a smooth balance of piney juniper, zesty citrus, soft florals, and warming spice from cassia and cinnamon. A long, elegant finish lingers with flavours of candied orange, dried fruit, and subtle forest pine — a true taste of the Highlands

Metaxa is a distinctive Greek spirit with a history that dates back to 1888, when Spyros Metaxa founded the House of Metaxa in Piraeus, the port of Athens. Coming from a family of silk merchants, Spyros sought to create a unique, smooth yet intense drink unlike traditional brandy or cognac. His creation blended aged wine distillates with sweet Muscat wines from the island of Samos and a secret mix of Mediterranean botanicals, including rose petals. This combination produced a mellow, aromatic spirit that became emblematic of Greek craftsmanship.

The “star” system in Metaxa’s lineup, such as the 12 Stars, generally indicates the level of maturation and complexity in the blend.

Metaxa 12 Stars represents one of the brand’s most refined expressions. It is crafted from Muscat wines—primarily from Samos—blended with aged wine distillates that mature in both medium- and heavily-toasted Limousin oak casks. During blending, a secret infusion of herbs and rose petals adds a delicate floral signature. The result is a radiant amber spirit bottled at 40% ABV, positioned as a rich, aromatic, and full-bodied member of the Metaxa family.

In the glass, Metaxa 12 Stars has a deep copper-amber hue. The aroma opens with notes of dried apricots, peaches, and raisins, layered with hints of orange peel, floral rose, and subtle touches of chocolate and coffee. On the palate, it is smooth yet vibrant—full of ripe fruit flavors, honeyed sweetness, and a light smokiness from toasted oak. Black pepper, vanilla, and toffee undertones emerge mid-palate, giving the spirit both warmth and balance. The finish is long, aromatic, and gently spiced, with lingering impressions of citrus peel, black tea, and oak.

Commandaria is a legendary sweet dessert wine from Cyprus, boasting the world's oldest PDO, with origins tracing back thousands of years. Its name derives from the period of the Crusades, when the Knights Templar established their headquarters—known as a “commandery”—in the region that produced it. The wine gained fame across medieval Europe, and in 1224, Commandaria, was crowned the winner at the French “Battle of the Wines.” It is produced only in 14 specific villages on the southern slopes of the Troodos Mountains in the Limassol district of Cyprus.

Commandaria is made primarily from two indigenous grape varieties: Xynisteri (a white grape) and Mavro (a red grape). The grapes are left to ripen fully on the vine, then sun-dried on mats to concentrate their sugars before pressing. The resulting must produces a naturally sweet, full-bodied wine. By regulation, Commandaria must be aged at least two years in oak barrels, during which it develops its signature depth and complexity.

The aromas are rich and evocative—honey, caramel, and dried fruits such as raisins, figs, and dates mingle with notes of roasted nuts, cocoa, and carob. On the palate, it is luscious and sweet but balanced by gentle acidity, with layers of toffee, orange peel, chocolate, and nutty undertones leading to a long, warming finish. Commandaria pairs beautifully with blue cheeses, roasted nuts, or desserts, though it is often enjoyed on its own as a meditative after-dinner wine. Renowned for both its ancient heritage and distinctive sun-dried richness, Commandaria remains one of the Mediterranean's great vinous treasures—a living link between Cyprus's winemaking past and present.
